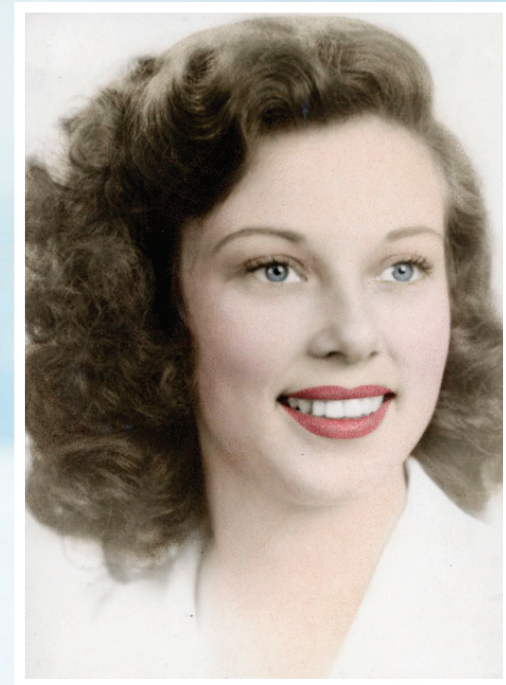
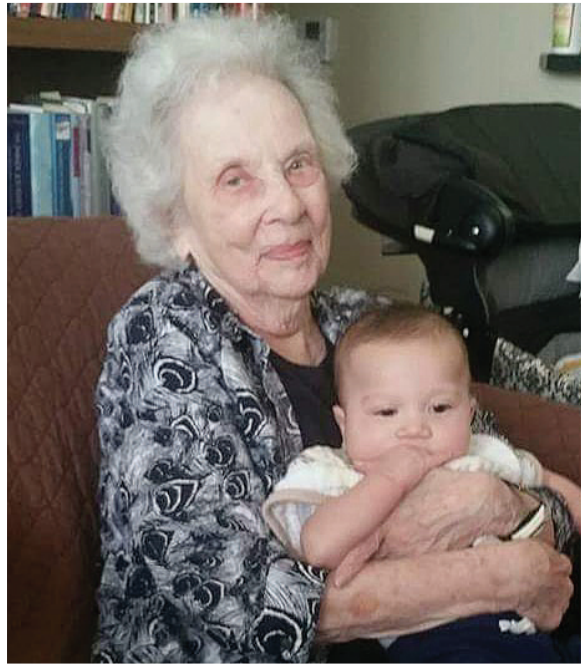

# Obituary

Elaine Levin, 93, passed away on September 11, 2018, at Northridge Hospital. She was born to Nettie and Walter Stern in Los Angeles on October 19, 1924. A fitting symbol of her happy childhood is the full-size walk-in dollhouse in their backyard that she and her sister Barbara played in. It was a gift from their father when he was the Director of Purchasing at Universal Studios.

Elaine graduated from Fairfax High School in 1942. She married her high school sweetheart Eddie Levin on April 14, 1943 in Fresno, California. For 65 years until his passing their marriage was a treasure that inspired many. She was a warm dedicated mom, always finding a way to be nurturing and supportive of her children.

Politicized by the Vietnam War, she proudly participated in the major anti-war protest at the Century Plaza Hotel in 1967, initiating a lifetime of enthusiasm for liberal candidates and causes. In the same year, Eddie and Elaine opened their shop The Nickelodeon, one of the very first Americana Collectibles shops on the west coast. For twenty-six years, until 1993, they had hundreds of devoted customers including collectors from all over the world and dozens of celebrities. During that time they also started The Mouse Club, the first organization of Disneyana collectors, and traveled extensively around the country buying and selling for their shop and collections.

Elaine was always outgoing and social. She made friends wherever she went. Into her nineties, she was still in touch with friends from her childhood and school days. She loved meeting with her Book Club and Support Group until weeks before her passing.

She is survived by sons Edward R. and Randy Levin, daughter Lori Breant, five grandchildren, Luke Breant, Rebecca Arce, Jonah and Isaac Levin, and Jennifer Emery, and three great-grandchildren, Max and Georgina Levin and Silas Arce.
